Greetings from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania, Southern Diocese

We, the Leadership of ELCT Southern Diocese together with Christians and Partner Parishes, we are greatly moved by the World Plague, Corona Virus, COVID - 19 the way it has hit the World. We understand that Germany is one of the Countries in Europe which is also affected.

Life has abruptly changed in the whole world. This shows how the world is connected in such a way that; when one person suffers, the whole world suffers.

Fear has fallen upon the whole humanity regardless of race, religion and geographical boundaries.

The plague has proved that we need the mercy of God to survive. We are in the lent season towards Passover. This reminds us of the work of Jesus on the cross, who poured out His precious blood for the whole world. In times such as this, Jesus Christ is our hope. Isaiah 53:4 "surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering..."

It is my hope that corona reminds us that the World needs more the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ to wash our souls than mere hand wash and sanitize our hands. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you".
